e-Permits

Apply for Permits Online

Through the on-line permitting process, certain permits are now available through ePermits. Customers can apply for and receive permits with a credit card. Once the process is complete, the customer will receive an email with the permit and inspection record card attached, which should be printed and displayed at the job site.



Search for Permits, Inspection Results and View Scheduled Inspections through ePermits

In addition to obtaining permits on-line, a search by permit number, address or contractor name can be done to view the following:

- Permits Issued
- Inspection results for a permit
- View scheduled inspections for a permit

These new features are available to the general public including Prospective Buyers/Homeowners, Real Estate Agents, Insurance Companies, Title Companies, Contractors and Current Residents/Homeowners.

Summer Safety

Now that summer is here, there will be family gatherings, kids playing outside, and fun in the sun. Don't forget to take the below precautions and stay safe. To a fun and safe summer!

Swimming pools

- Make sure pools are inspected regularly, cleaned, and properly disinfected.
- The safety barrier/fence is locked when unattended.
- Ensure that pool safety equipment are kept within proximity to the pool area at all times.
- Ensure water safety rules are clearly posted in a visible area and properly enforced.

Barbeque grills / fire pits

- Must be at least 15ft away from any multi-family structure
- No grills or open flame on any balcony in any multi-family structure
- Fire pits must be 1ft below the ground, 25ft away from any structure, fence, property line, or flammable material
- Fire pits cannot be more than 3ft in diameter and ringed with brick or rock
- Burn only clean dry wood and the wood must be in the pit at all times
- Flames not to exceed 3ft from the fire pit
